Sponsor - Port Pirie Philatelic Society



The first Port Pirie Philatelic Society (foundation date unknown) went into recess at the outbreak of the First World War in 1914. In August 1933 Herbert J Stacey (he moved from Strathalbyn to Port Pirie in 1908 to deal in clothing, footwear and groceries) arranged a meeting in October and at this meeting of 24 collectors the Port Pirie Philatelic Society was founded.

The Rev. John James Kilmartin was elected the first president of the society but almost immediately was transferred to the Hamley Bridge Methodist Church. (Kilmartin was the recipient of the Briskham Award in 1970.) Herbert Stacey was subsequently elected as president. Membership numbers fluctuated during the formative years and during this era meetings were held in the Trotting Club Rooms above Chris's Fish Shop in Alexander Street and on a hot night the stench was decidedly on the nose.

Night after night, Herbert, Laurie Hodder (secretary) and Jock Borthwick (exchange superintendent) would stand in Alexander Street wondering if a quorum would be reached. Usually members Bill Symonds and Ikey would arrive. Ikey was the cause of more fun at meetings than any other member. At the auctions he would examine very carefully every card of stamps with the business end of a naval telescope and solemnly bid a half penny. Laurie and Jock would invariably run Ikey up to three pence.

Ikey was a bootmaker who never used a pair of tweezers. His fingers were as black as pitch from the black boot stains he used. The pages of the exchange books after Ikey had studied them were ideal for finger printing! Ikey would meet every overseas ship at the Pirie wharves with a wheat bag of boots and a pocket full of very soiled cards with a few Commonwealth stamps and ask 2/- for them, most of which sold.

In 1938 the society set up an exchange circuit book scheme which initially served Port Pirie and Broken Hill. To receive the circuit book's one had

to be a member and consequently the membership rose to 65. The scheme was extended Australia-wide and membership rose to nearly 200!

Herbert Stacey was a man of many stories. He once told of a "chase" after some South Australian Departmentals. He heard on the grapevine that the Port Augusta Police Station was packed with old envelopes that had been officially received over the past 60 years. Herb upended himself and caught the goods train to Peterborough. From there he boarded the 10 mile an hour train to Port Augusta via Quorn, a journey of 190 miles. On arriving in Port Augusta he booked into a local hotel for a well earned rest. The following morning he presented at the local police station "oozing" charm. "No go" said the constable, a Mr Black from Port Pirie had called the previous week and collected all the old envelopes! Herb and Blackie were great buddies and Herb reckoned the "Old B" should have told him of his windfall.

The May 1947 edition of "THE AUSTRALIAN STAMP MONTHLY [ASM] included the following report of the March 1947 meeting: "Mr D R Brakenridge presided the meeting. A report by Mr J L Borthwick, exchange superintendent, stated that five books were broken up for the year and at present 20 books valued at 1,826 pounds are in circulation. Present membership is 180. Royal Visit stamps were distributed and covers carried on the Royal Train disposed by auction. Mr Borthwick gave an interesting account of his visits to Adelaide societies." That edition of the ASM also included reports of March meetings of the Philatelic Society of South Australia, Southern Districts Philatelic Society and the Philatelic Society of Woodville.

Another item in that ASM was headed: "JUNIOR STAMP CLUB". It read, "Mr C D Campbell, c/o Union Bank of Aust. Ltd., Jamestown, South Australia, has formed a local Junior Stamp Club in which all offices are held by young members. He would appreciate receiving from readers any old Gibbons Foreign or British Catalogues so that members can gain some idea of stamp order and arrangement."

The Port Pirie Philatelic Society has seen the founding and subsequent folding of the philatelic societies of Whyalla, Port Augusta, Peterborough, Snowtown, Moonta and Wallaroo. This has left Port Pirie in philatelic isolation with the Salisbury PS being the closest some 210 km south. Unfortunately this distance factor does not allow for exchange visits or visits by members of metropolitan societies.

Behind the PS of SA our society is the second oldest in South Australia. Like all philatelic societies it has experienced marked fluctuations in membership and significant demands to survive.

On Monday November 27th 2023 it celebrated its 90th anniversary with a luncheon in Port Pirie.



Invited guests included 3 senior board members of the South Australian Philatelic Council – Jenny Roland (then president), Nigel Carter (then vice-president) and Linda Welden (secretary). The Mayor of the Port Pirie Regional Council, Mr Leon Stephens, congratulated the society on its longevity and determination to continue.



Now in its 92nd year the society has members who reside in Wallaroo, Port Broughton, Crystal Brook, Clare, Spalding, Booleroo Centre, Napperby and Port Pirie. A change several years ago to hold meetings at 1 pm has certainly aided the continuation of the society. Members would prefer to see kangaroos on stamps rather than on the road at night.

The Port Pirie Philatelic Society is privileged to sponsor this edition of the SAPC News. We have a high regard for this publication as it goes some way for Port Pirie to connect with the wider philatelic “world”.

The Port Pirie Philatelic Society meets on the last Monday of each month (except December and January) at 1pm at the BHAS Bowling Club in Port Pirie.

Fellow of the British
Society of Australian Philately

This year Martin was elected Fellow of the British Society of Australian Philately (BSAP) for his outstanding contribution to Australian philately and the Society over several decades. He also received the 2024 President's Award from the British Society of Australian Philately (BSAP).

His publications include:

The Post, Telegraph and Telephone Offices of South Australia and the Northern Territory (2005), *The Revenue Stamps of South Australia* (2006), *The Parcel Stamps of South Australia* (2008) with Tony Presgrave, *Australia Stamp Replica Cards* (2015), and he made a substantial contribution to the three-volume *The Hand-held Postmarks of South Australia and the Northern Territory* (2013).

Martin also has published pamphlets and articles on a range of South Australian philatelic subjects. He has made presentations to BSAP and the Royal Philatelic Society of Victoria, regularly contributing via Zoom to the BSAP.

Martin has been awarded Gold and Large Gold medals at national and international levels for exhibits relating to South Australia. He is an experienced judge and supports National exhibitions. Aeropex 2019 was a successful National exhibition which drew international participants from the UK, USA, India and New Zealand. Without Martins dedication and persistence this exhibition would not have been so successful.

Whenever we in the UK are discussing South Australian philately, the name Martin Walker springs to mind and we are privileged to have him as a member of the BSAP.

Martin is a member of many clubs in South Australia, also Nationally and Internationally. Locally Martin is known for his promotion of philately, whether in the organising of Exhibitions like Aeropex 2019, Anpex 2022 or History month events for the Airmail Society or PSPHSA.

Martin was president of the South Australian Philatelic Council for 6 years and during that time he presided over the renovations to SAPHIL House.

Martin's collecting interests are many and varied and if asked he is happy to put on displays at clubs. He enters exhibitions locally, Nationally and Internationally. His material being of a very high standard, Martin has gained medal levels up to Large Gold, as well he has receiving Special Prizes. He is also a qualified judge in many different classes ranging from Traditional, Postal Stationery, Postal History, Aerophilately and Literature. Over the years Martin has judged at many of our local Congress's.

As a resident of Gawler, Martin has been involved with organising 2 exhibitions, the first was on - Communication in Gawler - titled "Down the Line". The exhibition explored the importance of long distance communication and how the postal service, the telegraph and the telephone were vital in keeping Gawler connected to the rest of the world. This year the exhibit has been on the history of Mothers Day via Mothers Day Cards.

For his work Martin was awarded the South Australian Lifelong Historian Award at a History Council of SA.

Martin has dedicated more than 50 years to researching and collecting the postal and telecommunications history of South Australia. He curated an exhibition of South Australian philatelic and post office history for the joint Texas/South Australian sesquicentennial. Martin has contributed material to a display of Gawler's role in WW1 for an exhibition in Cannakale, Turkey for the ANZAC centenary, as well as an exhibition in South Africa for the centenary of the Anglo-Boer War.

Martin understands the value and importance of reaching new generations and new audiences to instil a love of history. Importantly, he also recognises that people have different ways of engaging with knowledge and digesting information.



Alma Grace Downes
1941 - 2025

Alma was a tireless “behind the scenes” worker at National Exhibitions in every State and the ACT

working predominantly in the Bin Room but if not required in that role, helping with the mounting and dismounting of exhibits before and after shows.

Initially, under the tutelage of an experienced Bin Room manager, Alma inherited the role of Bin Room Manager for National Exhibitions held in Adelaide as well as continuing to work in the Bin Rooms interstate. In addition, Alma worked in the Bin Room at the International Exhibitions held in Melbourne, in 2013 and 2017, as well as being a Team Leader amongst the volunteers at both shows. Her contribution to organised philately at the national level was recognised in 2021 when she received the SPAN award, which stands for Services to Philately at the National level.

Closer to home, Alma was Secretary of the SA Philatelic Council from 2000 to 2005 as well as helping in the catering department for numerous National Stamp Exhibitions and Coin & Banknote Shows held at the Drill Hall in Adelaide as well as assisting with the catering when the APF's AGM was held in South Australia. Her services to philately in South Australia were recognised in 2016 when she was presented with the Briskham Award, the highest award that can be presented in this state.

Alma was a member up until her passing of the Australian Postcard Society and the Para Hills Philatelic Society. Other clubs she had been a member of with her husband Allan, were the Community PS and the Postal Stationery & Postal History Society serving in the roles of Treasurer and Committee Member and becoming a Life Member of Community.

Alma was also a supporter of State and National Exhibitions through her roles as a Juror in the Picture Postcard Class as well as an avid exhibitor in that class having attained medals to the level of Gold. Alma also represented South Australia as a team member in the Australasian Picture Postcard Challenges in 2016 & 2019 when on both occasions South Australia won the Challenge. Alma also supported Australian Philately overseas by exhibiting on several occasions.


The Society again participated in the History Festival with a presentation by Kerrie Dougherty OAM from the Australian Space Agency. Kerrie spoke on Australia's First Amateur Radio Satellite Australis-OSCAR5.

The satellite was constructed by a group of students at Melbourne University in the mid-1960s and made history as the first radio satellite built outside of the United States and Australia's second satellite. It may have been Australia's first satellite if space could have been found on a NASA rocket before WRESAT was launched in late 1967.

In a delightful case of serendipity one of those Melbourne University students, Owen Mace, now living in South Australia, spotted Kerrie's talk in the Festival programme and booked a place in the audience. Owen was able to delight the crowd with his first-hand accounts of the construction of the satellite and the effort to get it to the United States. He recalled meeting Sir Robert Menzies to ask for funds to fly to America to deliver the satellite. These were provided by a benevolent society. Apparently, it cost \$2,000 to deliver a satellite that the students had built for just \$1,400! Australis-OSCAR5 was eventually launched into space on 23 January 1970.



Owen also kindly donated to the society library a copy of a book on OSCAR5 written by himself and fellow student Richard Tonkin.

Lorenzo Giardiello 1936- 2025

Born in Ceppaloni, Benevento, Italy, Lorenzo is survived by three children and three grandchildren. He was a member of the Australian Postcard Society and the Eastern Districts Philatelic Society attending society meetings regularly.

Lorenzo collected stamps, covers, coins & bank notes, picture postcards and even matchbox labels. An area of specialisation were his silk postcards from the First World War which he exhibited internationally to Large Gold medal level (Hong Kong 2017) and Gold at Canakkale, Turkey for the Centenary of ANZAC in 2015. He also researched these postcards and wrote an article which was published in the Picture Postcard Monthly magazine.

Other exhibits included the 1908 American Fleet Visit (Gold), Rifle Markman's Contest (Gold) and Glamorous Ladies (Vermeil). Lorenzo also represented South Australia as a team member in the Australasian Picture Postcard Challenges in 2014 & 2019 when on both occasions South Australia won the Challenge

Glenside Philatelic Society

Report from Gordon Oates on his visit to Glenside

I was pleased to be invited to put on a display of QSL cards at the Saturday afternoon meeting of the Glenside Philatelic Society at SAPHIL House 19th April and enjoy their hospitality. As a practising licensed amateur radio operator myself I was able to explain some of the jargon used in the abbreviations frequently found on the cards, and explain their purpose, using both QSL cards I have exchanged myself and ones I have acquired from other sources.

Amateur radio operators under the terms of their licences as experimental radio are required to provide written confirmation of contacts with other stations, and before the days of the Internet the most expedient – and cheapest – way of doing this was in postcard format. At first these were sent directly between station operators but as the volume increased, the national amateur radio bodies undertook the responsibility for bulk mailings, setting up QSL Bureaus to handle the traffic.

Now confirmation is done largely by the Internet and QSL cards have virtually disappeared. Therefore I put together this five-frame display to show QSL cards in their original postcard format and then despatch by QSL Bureaus.

As well I included explanations of what the various abbreviations mean including QSL itself – I have a message for you, using the International Q Code originally drafted for ship to shore wireless but extending to other forms of communication. This Q code is still in use; barometric pressure settings for light aircraft use the term QNH for average mean sea level pressure and QFE for actual pressure at a particular location.



I also displayed three semi-automatic Morse keys that I own; a rather battered one from my days in the Army Signals sixty years ago; one that I bought in the 1980's as a replacement which I used for several QSO's for which I received some of the cards on display; and one similar to my original one which I was given several years ago in much better condition.

If any other society would like to see this display, please let me know and I will be happy to bring it to your meeting. I give my heartfelt thanks to the Glenside society for their invitation and their hospitality; it was very much appreciated.

Stamps of Dahomey & 'Benn were issued for the 200th anniversary, the 1974 issue had many stamps with different overprints on. The display also included stamps from Korea. After 2020 many stamps have been printed to commemorate the 250th anniversary (some say a glut).

Philatelic Society of South Australia

Philatelic Society of South Australia's Annual John Bell Memorial Shield Members Competition 26 April 2025. Disappointingly, there were only two entries in the competition, which was judged by Anthony Presgrave and Nigel Carter.

Martin W.'s display of the 1903 Kraus definitives of Paraguay

Martin's display traced this stamp issue from the original tender to essays, design development and eventual issue and use of both the ordinary and official stamps.

In January 1903 the Paraguayan Government invited tenders for a new series of postage and official stamps. The invitation specified the denominations and quantities of each stamp together with guidelines for its design, which was to feature the national coat of arms and include the country's motto.

First printed essays

The first printed essays showed the completed design with UNIVERSAL POSTAL UNION at the top of the stamp but omitted the motto "Pax Y Justicia". The issued stamps just had the initials UPU at the top of the stamp.

The contract was awarded to H. Kraus of Asuncion, and the stamps were issued from 28 February 1903.

The official stamps were ordinary stamps overprinted OFICIAL diagonally. However, there was minimal use of the official and the surplus stock was subsequently overprinted for ordinary postage use.



Following the increase of the internal letter rate to 20c in June 1908 the 5c official stamp was overprinted 20c for ordinary postal use.

Gordon M's thematic display of the Snow Leopard and Clouded Leopard on stamps.

Gordon's display opened with a diagram showing the respective ranges of the snow leopard and clouded leopard (both listed as vulnerable species). The snow leopard is native to the mountain ranges of Central and South Asia at elevations of 3,000 – 4,000 m. while the clouded leopard inhabits dense forests from the Himalayan foothills through Northeast India and Bhutan to mainland Southeast Asia into South China. Both species are solitary.

Gordon's display continued with information describing the species and an attractive selection of stamps, covers and miniature sheets portraying the two species. Several stamps featuring the species were issued by the countries of habitat. Others, such as the Australian 2016 postal and numismatic cover, promoted wildlife conservation.



Speaking on behalf of the judges, Anthony noted both entries were of a high standard. Martin's display comprehensively covered, with scarce original material, each stage of the development, production and usage of the 1903 Paraguay definitives stamp issue. The exhibit was well set out and attractive.

Gordon's exhibit was similarly well set out and attractive and included a wide range of stamps featuring the two leopard species. Noting, however, that the subject breadth of thematic displays generally limits the scope for an in-depth philatelic study, the judges decided the better display and the winner of the 2025 John Bell Memorial trophy was Martin Walker's study of the 1903 Paraguay definitives issue.

Philatelic Society Open Day

On the Open Day, activities commenced early with the arrangement of the 'Half Price Stamps' sales tables and the finalisation of the displays.

These exhibits were related to the history of South Australia, including early trading vessels on the Murray River, the Centenary celebrations in 1936, and the 1908 picture postcard series that depicted contemporary scenes, commerce, livestock, and wildlife.

The luncheon preparation faced a setback when the kitchen team couldn't get the hot plate to work. After consulting Linda we learned the pan was unsuitable for an induction hot plate. We transferred the contents to a SAPC pan, and the problem was resolved.

The doors opened at 10am, and attendees gradually increased. Many were members of the PS of SA or other Adelaide philatelic societies seeking to enhance their collections. Some visitors sought advice on selling childhood or inherited collections, while others attended due to History Month advertising. The meet and greet team (Di, Jennifer, Stuart, and David) welcomed visitors, introduced the Society, highlighted displays, and provided information on SAPC's free appraisal service and auctions. A total of 44 people signed the attendance register.

The luncheon menu (Toasties, Tuna Mornay and Soup) together with cakes, baked slices, tea and coffee proved popular, raising just over \$200 for Society funds. Many thanks to the catering team (Jennifer, Di, Julie and David) who prepared the food and supplied the ingredients.

As the closing time of 4pm approached, the number of visitors decreased, prompting the working group to begin dismantling the displays, packing up the dealers' tables, and restoring the meeting room to its usual condition. We are grateful for the assistance provided by Moira and Brett Robinson of the Glenside Philatelic Society in this endeavour.


